Long time Brittany enthusiast and reporter for the American Field, David Fletcher, was inducted into the BFTH this year after being inducted to the Pointer/ Setter Field Trial Hall of Fame last year. Dave became addicted to field trials early on and participated since 1957 all over the US and Canada as a handler, judge and reporter. In this report I'll highlight what Dave did in the Brittany world. He was a member of many years in the Michigan Brittany Club and later years the Western Michigan Club. His list of accomplishments are many, among them the ABC Quail Classic judge in Richmond, KY, the Eastern Futurity, and the US Open Brittany Championship 3 times. He served as reporter of the ABC National Open Gun Dog Championship when it was walking for several years. Over 30 years ago Dave began the national Brittany Open Grouse Championship in Gladwin, MI and it runs yet today. Anyone who has attended that event has wonderful memories.

Dave married his wife Carol in 1968 and Delmar Smith gave him a Bazooka's Brandy puppy, Shiawassee Sioux, as a wedding present. Dave raised several litters using studs such as Tondee's Sandy Valley Duke and Perry's Rustic Prince and dams by Magnum's Masked Man. His best litter produced HOF Rimarda's Trademark! Trademark was out of The Real Thing bred to his Shiawassee Showtime Babe and thrilled many a field trialer throughout his years campaigned by the Holmans and owned by Jim and Janet Chase.

Dave has been a Director of the Bird Dog Foundation for 22 years and Board Secretary most of that term. He produces the brochure and plaques for the

foundation each year. He teamed with Rheta Cartmell to produce the Brittany "Book of the Eighties" and printed the ABC Yearbook for 25 years. Special Note: Dave's wife Carol has been ill and could use your thoughts and prayers.

Our second inductee this year was Kent Patterson. His wife, mother and children with spouses attended the induction for this special honor. Anyone who has ever read a report that Kent has written of a trial or heard him speak knows of Kent's acumen with words and he's a tough act to follow! Kent has served in many capacities for our breed at the national, regional and local level. For 11 years he was a director of the East Central Region and served as the ABC National Field Trial dates coordinator. He currently chairs the ABC Hall of Fame Committee for dogs and is a member of the ABC Finance Committee. Kent has been the only ABC Tritronics/Garmin Shooting Dog Award Point Coordinator in its 11-year history and serves on the board of the BFTHF. In May he became only the 4th Purina Pro Plan Liaison for ABC. He is a founding member of the Music City Brittany Club and its Dixieland Championship where he has been field trial secretary for 19 years. He was also a founding member and director for the Deep South Brittany Free-for-All Championship, a two-series endurance event considered by breed stalwarts to be one of the most difficult championships to capture. His male, 5X Ch One-N-Only, won the title in back to back years 2006 & 2007. He has been on the ABC National All Age Field Trial Committee for 9 championships.

A bird hunter for over 50 years, Kent's passion is handling dogs, particularly big running all-age dogs and he is widely considered one of the most skilled amateur handlers in our breed in the country. Twice he has won the ABC National Amateur All Age Championship, in 2006 with Just Call Me Roy and in 2007 with his own dog Maxwell's White Spirit. He also took the Runner-up titles with Maxwell's Gunsmoke in 2008 and Piney Run Art in 2012. Kent has won 16 American Field Championships, from the Deep South's red clay to the Missouri Breaks of South Dakota and has judged all pointing breeds across the country.

A skilled wordsmith, Kent has written a variety of articles, both biographical and fiction, for the ABC magazine, American Field and Pointing Dog Journal. His "Patron" article honoring Jim and Janet Chase hangs in the Bird Dog Museum. He is much sought after as a reporter for trials in his "spare time!" Unselfish is a word that best describes Kent. His

great sportsmanship, good cheer, and long-time commitment to the Brittany at all levels makes him most deserving of induction into the BFTHF.
